Easter 2016 is a long weekend, beginning lunchtime on Friday 25th March and finishing at breakfast on Tuesday 29th March. There is another fun-packed programme of events and activities taking place throughout the weekend and hopefully there is something for everyone! One new item on the programme this year is "Desert Island Discussions" with the President - have you got a favourite book and piece of music? If so, this Easter is your chance to talk for up to 5 minutes about the book and music you would take onto a Desert island, so do come prepared! However, you are also more than welcome to just come and listen.

This year sees big changes to the AOSA Easter Gathering, certainly the biggest in my time as Easter Secretary. Changes in fire regulations mean that for the first time this year, we are responsible for knowing who is on site during the day as well as overnight. In addition, for several years now, the Easter weekend has run at a loss, and despite every effort to try and break even, we are still making significant losses each year. The AOSA Easter Gathering is a private event; the AOSA hire the school, the facilities, pay for school staff and for the food consumed during the weekend. We have historically relied on donations from day visitors to contribute towards the costs of running Easter, however, this has not generated significant revenue and the residents have continued to shoulder the majority of the costs for the weekend. The increase in residential charges has contributed to a decline in numbers staying in school. This puts the future of the weekend in jeopardy, so a charge for day visitors has become essential. This is being combined with a new booking system, and the introduction of visible forms of identification for all residents and visitors alike for security reasons, to ensure that we know everyone who is on site during the weekend is supposed to be there and has paid. School have had thefts and intruders prior to Easter most years and we are keen to promote Easter as a safe and secure environment. To this end, visitors will be required to wear a wristband, or have their hands stamped. This is for everyone's safety, and for the peace of mind of everyone attending. We ask that you respect this.

This year we are trialling 2 categories of day visitor:

- 1) An Exclusive Day Visitor this is for those who just want to pop into school for a few hours, meet friends and wander around, as paying this small charge does not include meals, does not include programme activities, and does not include use of any of the school facilities (such as the sports centre/swimming pool/music concert/etc)
- 2) An Inclusive Day Visitor this is for those who intend to spend most or all day at school, and paying this charge includes lunch and dinner (even if only one meal is eaten), includes all programme activities and includes use of all facilities.

In addition to the above, we are also accepting bookings for camping this year. You are welcome to sleep in your own tent or caravan/campervan if you would prefer to do so rather than sleep in school. We are unable to offer a proper campsite or proper camping facilities; there are no electric hook-ups, no waste water facilities, and no elsan disposal points. We are offering a pitch on a field for a tent, or an area of hard-standing for a camper/caravan, with washrooms/showers/toilets/car parking a short walk away. The charges for the camping tariff include breakfast, lunch and dinner, as well as all of the programme activities and use of school facilities (sports centre, swimming pool, etc.)

We have tried to keep the charges as low as possible for both residents and day visitors, in the hope that we can attract lots of people and break even. This will be the last year that we use the Easter 2013 prices, but if you book and pay for Easter 2017 before the end of Easter 2016, you will be able to come back next year at this year's prices.

I welcome any feedback regarding all these changes, and Easter weekend generally, during and after the weekend. This year, in order to collect specific information, there will be a questionnaire for those who are willing to take the time to complete one. Questionnaires will be available during Easter, please ask the Easter team. All fully-completed questionnaires received by Monday April 11th 2016 will be entered into a prize draw. The prize will be a free full weekend at Easter 2017 for the winner, and a half-price weekend for the runner-up. There will be separate questionnaires for children and the draw will take place at the AOSA Executive Meeting on April 16th 2016.
